COACH'S CORNER - DOUG TURNER

The OLBA has changed the rules this year so that the leads may remain on the green while Skips deliver their bowls. Leads, please remember to remain quietly standing behind the Vices so as to not disturb the Skips who are completing their shots. At the end of play retrieve the foot mat and pusher. After the vices have determined the score collect the jack and push the bowls back to the right of the mat. Prepare to deliver your bowls at the Skip's direction.

NOVICES

If you are an up to 5-year bowler you are eligible to enter the District playdowns and then the Provincials men's or women's novice championship. It is recommended that you get together now to form teams and play together. The Championships are at the end of August.

Keep Etobicoke at the forefront as did Vickie Hayler in 2012 did with Karen Waterman and Lynn Spencer winning the Gold Medal.

SOCIAL

There have been a lot of changes this year to how we run Social. The new system is:
