MEN'S IN-HOUSE PAIRS

A relatively brief sign-up period attracted 8 men to the 2018 Men's Pairs in-house games. Four evenly matched teams were formed by random draw. We played a three game round robin followed by a Championship Game between the top two teams.

The conditions of play were altered this year to ensure that every bowl of every end was important. We played three-bowl pairs rather than the traditional four-bowl format. This is now the way almost all pairs competitions are played internationally and at the top levels. There is less margin for error with only three bowls, along with fewer bowls in the head to impede the last shot. And the game goes more quickly.

In addition, we played the sets format many of us will recognise from our in-house singles, along with World Bowls Tour play and many other competitions. The advantage of sets play is that you're never out of the match even if you get off to a slow start. If the set score is tied after two sets, a best two-out-of-three tiebreak is played.

Four of the six matches went to the tiebreak. The final standings saw Hank Spencer and Clarke Slemon on top with three wins (two by tiebreak!). The other three teams were all tied at one win and two losses. Lynn

Fair and Russ Yurkow finished in second place because they had won the most sets among the three tied teams. It wasn't until the last shot of the second set of the last round robin game was played that they could book their ticket to the final.

The Championship Final ended up with Hank and Clarke prevailing after winning two very close sets.
